Supply. Armstrong Optima ceilings were used

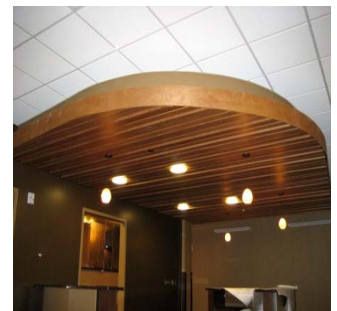
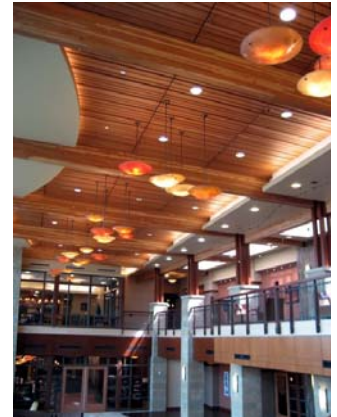


in all building corridors with Armstrong Ultima ceilings in the eleven tenant suites.
